

Inter Africa Cup Team Selection Criteria

The selection process will follow the SANEF General Regulations.

SHOWJUMPING:

South Africa may field two teams, a Young Rider Team and an Adult Team
Selection process will follow the SANEF General Regulations Appendix GR/J with the following criteria taken into consideration.

The Showjumping Technical Committee appointed selectors will select the team and the Chef d'Equipe and will revert to the Showjumping Technical Committee and then to MANCO for final ratification.

1. Selection is open to 1.00m and 1.10m horses and riders who have not competed higher than 1.10m in the past 12 month period.*
2. Selection is based on rankings and performance.
3. Each Province is to submit a list of the top 10 ranked horses for consideration. Only in the case where there are insufficient horses in 1.10m will the 1.00m horses be considered
4. The Chef d'Equipe plus the team riders will be awarded the relevant SANEF colours and tracksuit top, and will be permitted to compete with a South African Saddlecloth provided by SANEF for the event.
5. Teams must be declared no later than 14 days prior to the first day of the event - maximum 5 minimum 3 riders and horses.
6. Final nominations will take place prior to the event as notified in the programme.
7. Teams will comprise a maximum of 4 and a minimum of 3 riders, the top 3 scores to count.
8. Normal Team substitution rules will apply.
9. The competition will run under a modified Nations Cup where only 1 rider per team will be nominated to jump the second round.
10. Chef d'Equipe must be independent and have no affiliation to the team members.

DRESSAGE

South Africa may field two teams, a Young Rider Team and an Adult Team

1. Selection is open to Novice and Elementary horses and riders who have not competed higher than Elementary in the past 12 month period.*
2. Selection is based on rankings and performance.
3. Each Province is to submit a list of the top 10 ranked horses for consideration. Only in the case where there are insufficient horses in Elementary will the Novice horses be considered

4. The Chef d'Equipe plus the team riders will be awarded the relevant SANEF colours and tracksuit top, and will be permitted to compete with a South African Saddlecloth provided by SANEF for the event.
5. Teams must be declared no later than 14 days prior to the first day of the event - maximum 5 minimum 3 riders and horses.
6. Final nominations will take place prior to the event as notified in the programme.
7. Teams will comprise a maximum of 4 and a minimum of 3 riders, the top 3 scores to count.
8. Normal Team substitution rules will apply.
9. The competition will run over two prescribed tests, the top 3 overall combined scores to count.
10. Chef d'Equipe must be independent and have no affiliation to the team members.

EQUITATION

South Africa may field two teams, a Young Rider Team and an Adult Team

1. Selection is open to Intermediate riders who have not competed in Open Equitation in Junior or Adult. Horses must be currently jumping a minimum of 0.90m*
2. Selection is based on rankings and performance.
3. Each Province is to submit a list of the top 10 ranked riders for consideration.
4. The Chef d'Equipe plus the team riders will be awarded the relevant SANEF colours and tracksuit top, and will be permitted to compete with a South African saddlecloth provided by SANEF for the event.
5. Teams must be declared no later than 14 days prior to the first day of the event - maximum 5 minimum 3 riders and horses.
6. Final nominations will take place prior to the event as notified in the programme.
7. Teams will comprise a maximum of 4 and a minimum of 3 riders, the top 3 scores to count.
8. Normal Team substitution rules will apply.
9. The competition will run under the SANEF Equitation Rule 86.11
10. Chef d'Equipe must be independent and have no affiliation to the team members.

***Note - This is make the competition fairer for countries on borrowed horses.**
